PRODUCING AND DISSEMINATING STORIES OF CHANGE

What are Stories of Change, why collect and disseminate them ?



Stories of change (SoC) are a powerful tool **to demonstrate significant changes that occur as a result of a project**, in terms of behaviors, attitudes, knowledge, and practices, which are often not easily captured using quantitative metrics. SoC aim at identifying not only the changes that have occurred but also **the reasons why these changes happened** at various levels where projects intervene. Although usually SoC focus on positive results, they can also be used to investigate circumstances in which results were not achieved, and derive important lessons about the assumptions underlying the intervention. In change-oriented approaches to support research and innovation projects, SoC can be a valuable component of a project's Monitoring Evaluation and Learning (MEL) strategy, **linking project results with the concrete elements of the project architecture.**

Many DeSIRA projects are currently achieving results that can be captured by SoC, providing **learning opportunities** for all the actors in the niches within the Agricultural Innovation Systems (AIS) where they operate. Examples of actions that projects are undertaking, which lead to SoC, include: (1) encompassing a diversity of research-action interventions, at different levels, with different partners and purposes; (2) building new innovation partnerships with stakeholders from outside the formal and traditional agricultural research community; (3) setting up multi-actor innovation facilities; (4) engaging in farmer-led research or using co-creation methodologies at different stages of the research process; or (5) finding innovative ways to overcome managerial challenges related to operating in unpredictable and insecure contexts.

Developing the SoC requires reflecting upon the factors that have facilitated or constrained the change. The knowledge gained through this process is captured and stored in the SoC, strengthening the institutional memory of the organisations involved in DeSIRA projects. In a compelling and accessible way, **SoC use real-life examples to contribute to better understanding of the projects overall results or the potential future results**. This provides DeSIRA project executors and funders with a tool by which to communicate the value of their work to a wider audience.
