ECOM Agroindustrial Corp Limited


Founded in 1849 Headquartered in Switzerland

2nd worldwide trader in coffee, largest coffee miller 3rd in cocoa, in the top 5 for cotton

"Origin-integrated company": focused on buying from producers at origin, providing primary processing, logistics and risk management services, and selling to the branded product manufacturers (coffee roasters, cotton textile mills, and chocolate manufacturers).

#### **Operates in over 40 producer countries**

Works close to producers through SMS – Sustainable Management Services – Field technicians and agronomic team implementing regenerative agriculture in supply chain















## Collaboration with CIRAD

#### 22 years of joint work

Foundational challenges linked with low productivity, disease prone, and climate sensitive coffee varieties.

- Building partnerships with the private sector and coffee stakeholders guarantees that innovations are adopted
- Create a dialogue with the downstream sector
- Pooling of resources and original governance to address the main challenges of the sector
- Very limited coffee public research community (and no CGIAR, no seed company..) -> necessity to build partnerships between the best private and public laboratories
- Possibility of long-term collaboration are more adapted and efficient to address major challenges such as breeding resilient varieties, climate change adaptation and agroecological transition

#### Outcomes:

- In vitro culture laboratories in Nicaragua and Mexico somatic embryogenesis (SE)
- Nurseries for the regeneration of pre-germinated SE embryos
- Cutting and mini-grafting units
- Seedling acclimatization nurseries






# Key highlights

✓ Bilateral research ECOM-CIRAD aiming at "semiprivate" results (private but also developmental): breeding and dissemination worldwide of varieties more resilient to climate change and adapted to agroecology (2002-present)



- **Outcomes**
- Innovative coffee varieties
- Ability to implement agroforestry programmes around our operations

- ✓ Research in public-private consortia with EU public research and innovation funds, with the objective of open science and public good: these are H2020 BreedCafs (2017-2021) to adapting coffee to agroforestry and Horizon Europe Bolero (2022-2026) to boost the selection of more resilient root system in the context of climate change
- Development-oriented multi-lateral pre-competitive initiative with the entire coffee sector: ECOFFEE (2020-2026), aiming at eliminating pesticides in coffee cultivation



- Further trials and testing for improved breeding of ECOM-CIRAD varieties
- Knowledge for farm climate adaptation and resilience practices



- Data and knowledge sharing on pesticide practices
- Direct support for innovative farm management trials at origin
